




### President's Message

Spring is here and summer just around the corner. The point of the 2024 Fluffybutt (FB) contest is to get out and ride, no excuses. On some of the rides, you might consider getting a small group of members together. Just email to the club address and say when/where you're leaving. Group rides are more fun especially if you stop for lunch along the way.

This year there are 65 Fluffybutt locations. Points are given for each location achieved. The rules

are very simple. Go to the location and take a picture of you (in helmet) or your bike with the FB object or sign in the background and email it too: fluffybutt@casano.com. In the subject line include 1) your name, and the number of the FB site. Send one email per FB site which will make it easier to count/post your submission. Make sure your name is shown so you will be credited with the item (sometimes it is not apparent who you are from your email address).

This year you will also earn points for riding to monthly meetings, Saturday breakfasts, Moribundi lunches (1 point each). More points can be earned if you attend national rallies like for the MOA or RA (3 points each) or regional events with local clubs like, New Sweden & Skylands (2 points).

example, there are three Appalachian Trail sign sites, all in the northwest NJ, however the zip code list has one of them down the list and not near the other two. So use your head to readjust if necessary to pick them all up in one ride. Also on our Fluffybutt website page, there is a link to a Google spreadsheet where you can view your posted ride results as well as for other members.

The FB contest has started and will end October 30. 2024. Awards will be given out at our Club Holiday dinner.
